In August, Danielle Eubank (b. 1968) sets sail as resident artist aboard the Phoenicia, a 70foot-long replica of a ship believed to have circumnavigated Africa in 600 BC. Recently constructed in Syria, it has been designed using evidence from shipwrecks and other finds. Led by the British adventurer Philip Beale, this 10month voyage by a multi-national crew of 20 will cover 17,000 miles. Recently returned to Los Angeles after a decade in England, Eubank is an ideal shipmate in view of her simultaneously realistic and transcendent paintings of watery surfaces, observed around the world.
